Note on back: “Picture presented to Zeller Mental Health Center on 8-12-93, by Betty J. Whetstone. Betty’s mother, Carrie Swofford McKittrick was a member of this class, but changed to Dietetics before graduating. Betty’s father, Richard P. McKittrick, was head of meat department at PSH. Her parents married while working at PSH, November 5, 1908.

Betty bought picture from James Pye’s estate several years ago. His mother, Eula May Jackson, is a member of the graduating class.

Betty is Mrs. James Whetstone. She and husband are moving to St. Augustine Retirement Home. She is now 72 y/o. – By Arlene Parr” – Date of note unknown.
